\$6,000.00 Paid Investors

The Tryon Federal Savings & Loan association has mailed out dividend checks amounting to approximately \$6,000 to people who have been investing their savings with the TFS&LA the past six months. The association has been paying four per cent without fail since its organization. All deposits are guaranteed up to \$5,000 by a federal insurance agency. M. R. McCown, secretary - treasurer of the association, says the organization will become a great reservoir of surplus money which will be put to use to rebuild communities when money is needed. The association encourages its members to buy War Bonds and Stamps. A monthly report mailed July 1st, showed that the local organization had bought \$5,000 worth of War Bonds. Just recently the indebtedness on two homes was paid up and the mortgage cancelled through regular savings deposits made through the Tryon Federal Savings & Loan association.
