NURSE'S AIDE CLASS

Due to the shortage of nurses in Polk County it is essential to get ahead now for a possible emergency, and train a group of women under the auspices of the American National Red Cross to be Nurse's Aides. Mrs. Packer, superintendent of St. Luke's hospital, has consented to instruct such a class, with Mrs. William Gray as her assistant.

The following requirements are necessary to join the class. Each applicant **MUST**:

1. Be between the ages of 18 and 50.
2. Stand a physical examination.
3. Have had a Standard Course in First Aid.
4. Be a graduate from a high school, or its equivalent.
5. (a) Be willing to take a course of 35 hours class work, 3 nights a week, (Monday, Wednesday and Friday).
- (b) Followed by 45 hours supervised work in the hospital.
6. After above course, volunteer 150 hours hospital work.
7. Sign pledge never to accept any fee for her nursing services.

Mrs. Carl Gottfried is chairman of the Nurse's Aide Committee. She will announce later place for enrollment, also if there are any questions to be asked, arrangements for an interview will be made.—(Contributed).
