Weather Monday: high 73, low 46. Monday night there were snow flurries and early Tuesday morning strong winds hit the area, causing some building to loose their roofs, trees to fall across power lines, etc. Duke Power Co. had called all of their man in by 5 a.m. and in addition to the local crews had the services of three out of town tree crews and 5 out of town line crews, helping restore electricity.
