Weather Friday: high 57, low 30; Saturday: high 40, low 13, precipitation .12 (1½" of snow); Sunday: high 38, low 18, at 7 a.m. Monday .63 inches.

## Hendon Declines Calendars, Saves \$7,500

WASHINGTON — U. S. Representative Bill Hendon, the 11th District Congressman representing Western North Carolina, has declined receipt of his allocation of constituent calendars from the House. He decided not to accept the offer of up to 2,500 97th Congress calendars, priced at \$3 each, in an effort to do his part in saving taxpayers' dollars.

"We're just trying to do what we can to cut back on what we consider to be non-essential government expenses," Hendon said. "Had every Congressional office chosen to take this approach, the total estimated savings could have amounted to \$3.2 million," Hendon explained.

Congressman Hendon has also sent a letter to the Clerk of the House of Representatives requesting that the \$7,500 saved through his denial of the calendars be returned to the Treasury.
