## Minor Earthquake Felt Here

A minor earthquake centered on the North Carolina-South Carolina line, accompanied with a loud noise some persons took to be a sonic boom or thunder, shook a wide area of Western North Carolina and upper South Carolina Tuesday at 5:22 p.m. There were no reports of injuries or major damage from the tremor which the U. S. Geological Survey's National Earthquake Information Service said measured 3.0 to 3.5 on the Richter scale.

Many people in this area felt the tremor, but others were unaware that it took place.
