A 25-year-old acrobat wearing a red and white Spiderman outfit conquered the world's tallest building Monday, climbing all the way up the sheer west face of the 1,454 foot high Sears Tower in Chicago in a 7½ hour exploit. As hundreds watched in the downtown street below, Daniel Goodwin of Las Vegas, Nev. was handcuffed and taken into custody as he reached the roof of the 110-story building.
