got rain, but not nearly enough. Refusing to reverse longstanding military tradition, the U.S. Supreme Court affirmed Thursday that women are exempt from registration and the draft. And it implicitly approved, as well, the exclusion of female enlistees from combat. By a 6-3 vote, the justices ruled that Military Selective Service Act is constitutional. A lower federal court had ruled that the 1949 law fosters unconstitutional sex discrimination against men.

Lt. Gov. Jimmy Green has acknowledged to state officials that he accepted a cash gift of about \$4,775 from a paving contractor in 1977, but the Wake County district attorney said Green did not appear to have broken any laws and he will not be charged with any criminal offenses.
