Mayor Ted Owens of Columbus has asked that all Columbus water users refrain from watering their garden, lawn or washing cars. Mayor Owens said that the extremely hot and dry weather has cut the Columbus water supply in half. He urged that everyone cooperate in the effort to conserve water.

North Carolina joined eight other Southern states Tuesday in a quarantine of California fruit and vegetables to avoid possible crop infestation by Mediterranean fruit flies. The quarantine won't necessarily stop the produce from entering the state, but it will subject the produce to scrutiny and possible rejection.
