"I am deeply saddened to learn of the death of one of North Carolina's leading citizens and one of my best friends, Theo Burrell. Theo Burrell was the leader in my campaign for Lieutenant Governor in 1972 and I have relied on him for advice in improving North Carolina for the last ten years.

"He was one of the most deeply dedicated Christian men I have ever known and I am so thankful for the example he set for others to follow. Our State is a better place for his leadership and Polk County owes much of its progress to him and his family. I extend my deepest sympathy to his wife and their son, Harold and his family."
