Haley To Discuss Heritage

Alex Haley, author, of the Autobiography of Malcolm X, will discuss "Black Heritage - A Saga of Black History" at Winston-Salem State University in Hauser Student Union Thursday, October 3rd at 8:15 P.M. This lecture is the second program of W.S.S.U.'s 1974-75 Lyceum Events-Performing Arts and Lecture Series.. No admission will be charged.

Haley's book, Autobiography of Malcolm X", an "as-told-to" story was a result of two years of interviewing Malcolm X. The book sold over three and one-half million copies. The book was selected among the "Ten Best American Books of the 1960's Decade".

Most recently Haley was engaged in an intensive research project. From oral history, family lineage clues said to be passed down to him in Tennessee by his maternal grandmother, Haley said that he has traced that side of his family back to a Mandingo youth named Kunta Kinte, from the small village of Juffure, the Gambia, West Africa. Haley said that this slave, his seventh-generation forefather, was transported to Colonial America in the American slaveship, "Lord Ligonier", which arrived in Annapolis, Maryland, September 29, 1767.
