

WSSU Receives Grant

Winston-Salem State University has accepted a landscapint project as a gift from the Hanes Foundation, according to a news release from the university. C.C. Ross, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, announced that the gift will beautify the site of the new auditorium that is under construction on the campus. The project involves

plans for a sculpture gader that will feature works by outstanding black artists.

The new auditorium and garden will be named in honor of the University's president, Dr. Kenneth R. Williams. The auditorium is scheduled to be completed in March of next year. A dedication ceremony is tentatively scheduled for

'Of Men And Women'

Barbara Walters, co-host of "Today", and Tom Synder, host of "Tomorrow," will co-anchor a special (of men and women) examining the changing relationships between women and men in this country.

Among the provocative questions the program will explore are these: Are marriages becoming obsolete? Are the one-man woman and the one-woman man no longer acceptable? How has the radical change in sexual habits affected male-femate relationships? Do extra-marital relationships generate a psychological boost, or do they, in the long run, simply create more frustration and depression? How widespread are the

popular proclaimed beliefs that homosexuality and bisexuality are "normal"?

The program will examine the increasing movement of women into politics, the degree of willingness of men to give up traditional male power, the concern about "sexist" attitudes in many textbooks.

The program will also try to determine how lasting the changes will be and whether traditional views might eventually prevail after reaction sets in. Among the men and women whose views are being sought are biologists, anthropologists, psychiatrists, sociologists, marriage counselors, politicians, business executives, entertainers and authors.

(2) be currently enrolled in a college or university, and (3) have satisfactorily completed three years of college by June, 1975.

The Governor noted that applications must be mailed to the Institute of Government by February 1. Application forms and brochures describing the program may be obtained from college and university departmental and placement officials, local offices of the North Carolina Employment Security Commission, the State Personnel Office in Raleigh, and the Institute of Government in Chapel Hill.
