Rev. Hunt Appointed Assistant To 5th District Representative

The Rev. James Louis Hunt, pastor of Goler Memorial A.M.E. Zion Church, has joined the staff of Fifth District Rep. Steve Neal as a district assistant.

For the past two years, the Rev. Mr. Hunt has been employed as employment manager at Wake Forest University. Previously, he worked for seven years with the Experiment in Self-Reliance (ESR), first as a specialist in job development

and later as chief of orientation and assessment in the Community Employment Program.

A native of Asheville, Hunt came to Winston-Salem 11 years ago after serving several pastorates in Western North Carolina. He is a graduate of Livingstone College and has been an ordained minister for 27 years. He will continue to serve as pastor of Goler Memorial.

President of the Dungeon Club and Advisor to the Youth Employment Program) for political reasons."

Wiley said many officials want to make Liberty Street's "strip" a business area. The blame for the incident, according to Wiley, lies in the economic and social problems in the area. The Youth Program director stated that the police respect property more than black life. Sumler agreed with Wiley.

He pointed out that the concert was held from 8:30 p.m. until 10:30 p.m. and that the trouble started around midnight.

Sumler said there were

more than 1,000 people at the concert and that only about 300 people were on the "strip" when the trouble started. "The crowd that caused the trouble," according to Sumler has been around here for three or four years.

Sumler added fuel to Wiley's statements that remarks about the program were aimed towards discrediting him personally.

Sumler, who was fired from his job with the city's Recreation Department in February, now has a \$600,000 law suit pending. He stated that there is an attempt to eliminate him from the city of Winston-Salem.

Sumler stated that "something must be going on when city officials making \$30,000 a year object to a \$25,000 grant being given to provide summer jobs for young people."

Wiley said the program does not begin to meet the needs for jobs for young people in the area. Wiley said, however, that the program does provide jobs for some 25 young people in the area. "It helps kids channel their energy in a positive manner. More people and organizations should do this," he said.
