Rocky Dumps Ford - Does It Matter?

The announcement by Vice-President Nelson Rockefeller

earlier this week that he will not be a Vice Presidential candidate in 1976 has caused quite a stir in the Republican Party.

Many party members feel that President Ford's chances of election in 1976 have been greatly enhanced by Rockefeller's decision, while others feel that this will hurt him considerably.

This week the "Man in the Street" asked the City's citizens what effect the Rockefeller decision will have.

William Fair, 32, said, "I'd rather for him to stay on the ticket, but his resignation really won't mean anything to me. I wouldn't vote for Ford with or without Rocky."

C.C. Hobson, 68, stated, "I don't think it will help Ford's chances. I'm a strong democrat and I wouldn't vote for any republican. Ford has done a very poor job as

President."
Mary Jean Belton, answered, "I don't think Rocky's decision will have anything to do with the election. Mr. Ford has been in office long enough to make his own decision."

From the answers given by the people interviewed the indication is that Rockefeller's decision will have little or no influence on the outcome of the 1976 Presidential election.
