Lloyd United Presbyterian

Rededication Service Slated

Lloyd United Presbyterian Church, 748 Chestnut Street, was founded in 1886. The first Moderator was The Reverend W.L. Bethel from 1886 to 1889, the first Clerk of Session was Elder F.M. Martin, the second Moderator and Pastor was The Reverend Dr. J.C. Alston from 1889 until 1946, and the third Moderator and Pastor was The Reverend State W. Alexander II from 1947 until 1968.

Other Moderators of Session were The Reverend Dr. J.D. Peterson; 1946-1947, The Reverend J.E. McKenzie; 1968-1971, and The Reverend Catherine Reed who is now Moderator since 1971.

Lloyd Presbyterian Church was formerly known as the Colored Presbyterian Church, the Winston Presbyterian Church, and The Second Presbyterian Church. The name was changed to Lloyd Presbyterian Church on December 27, 1891 by action of the Session, and approved by Yadkin Presbytery on April

20, 1892.

On Sunday, March 27, 1977 Lloyd United Presbyterian Church held a Rededication Service. Elder E.L. Patterson, Clerk of Session, gave remarks and made the Statement of Rededication. Expressions came from Grace United Presbyterian Church by Elder F.K. Thomas, Clerk of Session, from the Yadkin Presbytery by Dr. J.D. Peterson, Stated Clerk of Yadkin Presbytery and pastor of Grace United Presbyterian Church; from the Synod of the Piedmont by Elder Leo M. Hatton, Director of Interpretation and Stewardship, and from the County Government, Mrs. Mazie Woodruff a Forsyth County Commissioner.

Following a dedication of memorials and gifts Mr. Norman F. Brown, Moderator Catawba Synod Westminster Fellowship, 1966-67, presented speaker, Reverend State W. Alexander II, Christian Education Consultant, Catawba Inter-

Presbytery Program Agency, who delivered the message for the Rededication Service. The service closed following remarks and acknowledgments.

Music for the service was furnished by Dellabrook Presbyterian Church Choir through the courtesy of their Session and congregation. Elder Rudolph V. Boone is the minister of music at Dellabrook Presbyterian Church.

Member, friends of the church, and patrons unselfishly gave of themselves toward making the Rededication Service a success.
