Mr. Frederick Albert Clement, 75, passed Sunday at his home of retirement of 16734 Forrer Avenue in Detroit, Michigan, following a brief illness. Mr. F. Clement is survived by his wife, Helen Bryant Clement, of the home; a daughter, Nancy Clement Butler of Detroit; a son, Charles C. Clement, of Winston-Salem; three sisters, Dr. Abbie Clement Jackson of Louisville, Kentucky; Mrs. Ruth Bond of Washington, D.C.; Dr. Emma Walker of Birmingham, Alabama; one brother, George Clement of Cincinnati, Ohio; and grand children, nieces and nephews.

The deceased was the son of the late Bishop George C. Clement of

Mocksville and the late Emma Clarissa Clement, 1946's First Black Mother of the Year in United States History. Before regional re-divisioning of the Kappa Alpha Psi National Fraternity, Mr. F. Clement served the Winston-Salem area as Provincial Polemarch from his residence in Institute, West Virginia. Mr. Clement retired after 41 years of service from West Virginia State College

where he held the position as Head of the Physics Department until 1971. He was a graduate of Northwestern University.

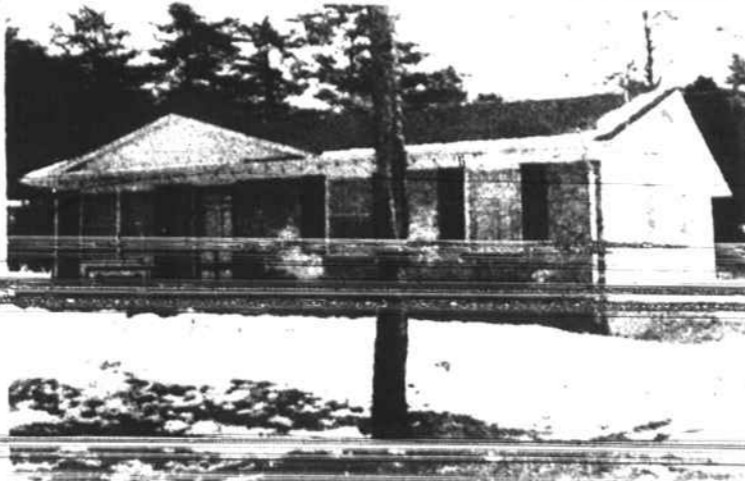
