Meeting Set to Discuss Credit

A Cadillac eldorado, boat & thousands of dollars worth of clothing were recently obtained from several Winston-Salem credit grantors by fraudulent means. In another scam area credit grantors were bilked to the tune of over 1/4 million \$\$\$\$\$. Several of our leading merchants and lending institutions were victimized.

These are just two of numerous examples of credit fraud cases uncovered right here in Winston-Salem. This form of white collar crime is definitely on the rise. What can you do about it? You can begin by learning to spot the danger signs and thus prevent losses before your company is taken.

On Thursday, September 21, the Winston-Salem Retail Merchants Association will sponsor a Credit Application Fraud Control Seminar from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Downtowner Motor Inn. Credit department managers will learn how to recognize fraud applications and how to take

decisive action. Credit analysts/checker will learn how to use practical and effective methods in detecting fraud applications. Collectors will be assisted in distinguishing between fraud applications and collection problems so that appropriate action can be taken. Security personnel will receive information about investigations, enforcement, and prosecution procedures.

Mr. G. Pat Bland and Ms. Barbara Coe, nationally recognized experts in the field of credit and fraudulent practices, will conduct the session. Mr. Bland, currently manager of Subscriber Security Awareness with the California-based TRW Credit Data Corporation, has served as special agent in charge of the fraud application section of the Western States Bank Card Association. His 19 years of investigative background include nine years as a police detective and several years as a private criminal investigator.

money in people's pockets on pay day and would provide for expansion, new jobs and hope for the future.

Neal said that creating jobs was not an easy problem to solve and that the Kemp-Roth bill was a tax break for the wealthy in disguise and would do little for the lower income families.

He called the Kemp-Roth bill, "The guaranteed 100 billion dollar deficit that guarantees inflation bill, special interest tax bill for the wealthy."

In the area of tuition tax credits, Neal said that he voted against it saying that it was "essentially a religious issue."

Horton said that he supported tuition tax credits because it gives low income families a choice.

"The public school system is the only game in town, because if black parents aren't satisfied with the quality of instruction in the public schools they don't have an option unless they're rich," Horton said.

"Tuition tax credits give them a freedom of choice that we all need to have."

The candidates also discussed:

NEAL said, "I do not support quotas, but I do support some kind of Affirmative action."

HORTON said, "I would restrict the use of quotas, because when you establish quotas you also establish a ceiling. Frankly I would think we should be committed to a color blind society."

LOW INCOME HOUSING:

NEAL said he had toured housing in the district. He thinks it is a tremendous success story.

HORTON said, "Low income housing has not been what it ought to be." Since 1961 4,400 homes have been destroyed and only 3,000 have been replaced in Winston-Salem, said Horton.
