"The advantage I see in education is the positive change I can make in young lives," Hairston said. "It is great to see a child who is expected to fail, through a team effort of the student and teacher, achieve."

Hairston said being a female principal hasn't presented any problems.

"Women principals are treated like men principals," Hairston said. "The field is wide-open, and with the training and experience when positions become available women can move up."

Hairston said she defines success in terms of self satisfaction.

"The relationship with the teacher, students, community and parents, your ability to make practical decisions are all part of being successful." Hairston said. "How you see yourself is very important."

ANNIE KENNEDY was the second black woman in the state of North Carolina to pass the bar. Being a woman lawyer she said had its advantages.

"When I first started practicing law I would take cases outside of Forsyth County and most people had never seen a woman lawyer," Kennedy said. "They would come and talk to me and ask me questions, because I was a woman."

Kennedy is in a law practice with her husband and sons. When she was in school her ambition be a lawyer.

While she was a student at Spellman, and it came time for her to declare her major she put down business administration, but they called it economics because a girl wasn't expected to go in that field. When she decided to go to law school her dean tried to discourage

"Young women weren't supposed to go into law," Kennedy said. "Back then women went into nursing or were teachers."

Because of segregation she couldn't go to law school in the state, so Georgia paid her tuition to go to Howard Law School, where she was the only female in her class.

In addition to practicing law full time, Kennedy also helps to raise a family.

"I've always had the help and support from my husband," Kennedy stated. "We never had any roles and it has been a family affair in terms of rearing children.'

Kennedy said that more and more women are going into law school and that law is a good area for women.

"There are so many areas where their services can be offered." Kennedy said. "Young people have so many varied opporutnities that they don't all have to practice law."

GEORGIA SMITH was motivated to go into banking to prove something to herself. Twenty years ago when she was working an another job her co-worker made a statement that went on to change her life.

Smith was told at her old job, "You're going to stay here until you die," That statement motivated her to start thinking and as a result she moved into the area of banking. She began as a teller and today she is Branch Manager of Wachovia's North Office.

"It may have been being at the right place at the right time," Smith says of her position as Branch Manager. "It was part of the banks affirmative action program and race may have been to my advantage but


