and the Archeology and Historic Preservation Section, the morning session will cover research sources available in the N.C. Archives and how to use them.

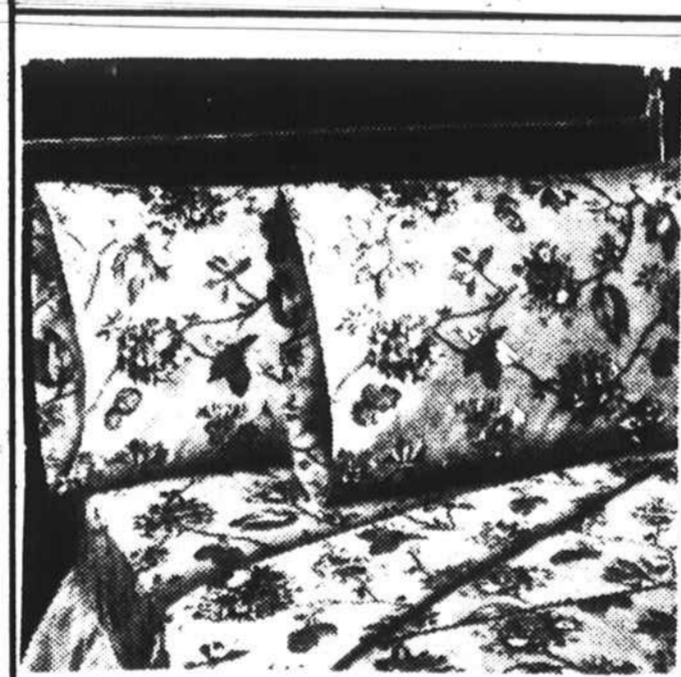
