Gaines was one of five persons inducted into the hall last week. The others were Forrest "Smokey' Burgess, an 18 year Major League veteran, who holds the record for career pinch hits with 145. Tennis great Allen Morris, former pro golfing star Johnny Palmer, and all around sports star Bob Gantt, who has been called Dixie's Finest Athlete.


