Youth Exposed to Serious Dance At NCSA Meet



On the stage of the DeMille Theatre at the North Carolina School of the Arts, the Beverly Allen Dancers whirled and spun their way through a complex folk

•to highlight that JAZZ is now a universal language of music throughout the world;


