The chairman of the state Human Relations Commission has strongly urged city officials to hire more staff for the local commission.

"If you're going to be viable, one man can't do it alone," Dr. Jerry Drayton told participants at the first annual Human Relations banquet sponsored by the local agency.

More than 100 participants filled the ballroom of the Hauser Student Union at WSSU for the event, a turnout regarded as a strong show of support by commission officials.

Benjamin S. Ruffin, a gubernatorial assistant, echoed Drayton's theme: "You can't do it without sufficient staff; without sufficient authority."

Another speaker was Dr. Jack Noffsinger, pastor of Knollwood Baptist Church and an internationally-known theologian. He told the audience that the goals of Christianity and good human relations are compatible.

"The main leaders the civil rights movement, both black and white were religious leaders," said Noffsinger. He said the best expression of good human relations in Winston-Salem came when more than 200 ministers banded together to call for an effective school integration plan in the 1960s.

## Scholar Receives 2 Grants

Walter E. Black III, a senior at East Forsyth High School, recently found himself in an unusual situation. He received two scholarships to the same school.

Last week, the John Motley Morehead Foundation announced that Black was one of 65 recipients of the Morehead Award to study at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Black had already been awarded a scholarship to attend UNC-CH to play football.

"Naturally I took the Morehead," said the All-City/County defensive end and all-conference running back. "I want to major in business and pursue a career in law after I graduate."

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Walter B. Black Jr., of 610 Meadowlark Road, Kernersville, Black is a member of the National Honor Society, president of the student council, a national achievement semifinalist and co-captain of the varsity track and football teams.

A Morehead Award, patterned after the Rhodes Scholarships at Oxford University in England, is worth \$13,000 to North Carolina students for four years, and is presented to students for superior achievement and potential, a spokesperson said.
