# Starnes completes Marine recruit training

Marine Pfc. Glenn L. Starnes, son of Willie J. and Ada M. Starnes of Moravia Street, has completed recruit training at the Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island, S.C.

During the 11-week training cycle, he learned the basics of battlefield survival. He was introduced to the typical daily routine that he will experience

during his enlistment and studied the personal and professional standards traditionally exhibited by Marines.

He participated in an active physical conditioning program and gained proficiency in a variety of military skills, including first aid, rifle marksmanship and close-order drill. Teamwork and self-discipline were

emphasized throughout the training cycle.

Navy Storekeeper Dwayne E. Williford, son of Amanda Williford of oak Street, has completed recruit training at the Naval Training Center, San Diego, Calif.

During the eight-week training cycle, trainees studied general military subjects designed to prepare

them for further academic and on-the-job training in one of the Navy's 85 basic occupational fields.

Included in their studies were seamanship, close-order drill, naval history and first aid. Personnel who complete this course of instruction are eligible for three hours of college credit in physical education and hygiene.

"Shoot," Spring says, "you couldn't tell me nothin' when I got paid for my first gig. I was proud of that dollar."

Locally, Spring and his band have appeared at various night clubs. He also performs solo on the keyboard but says as soon as he gets "the wax," it's back on the road again.

"I feel sorry for the guys here who are afraid to leave Winston," Spring says, "because there's a lot of good talent here."

"They call Winston the city of entertainment and the

arts," he says. "Now places like New Orleans and Vegas, they're the entertainment cities. This is the cigarette city."

The glamour and notoriety Spring gained from his many travels on the West Coast and his Vegas show days are now images in his coveted photo album. But if fate is on his side, he says, those days will come again even bigger and better. And the chances that he might fail don't bother him.

"I've never thought about not making it," Spring says. "If I have to be on the road another 15 years, I will."

"I have no other alternative but to be a success," he says. "I'm just as gung ho now as I was the first time I left when people said I wouldn't last."
