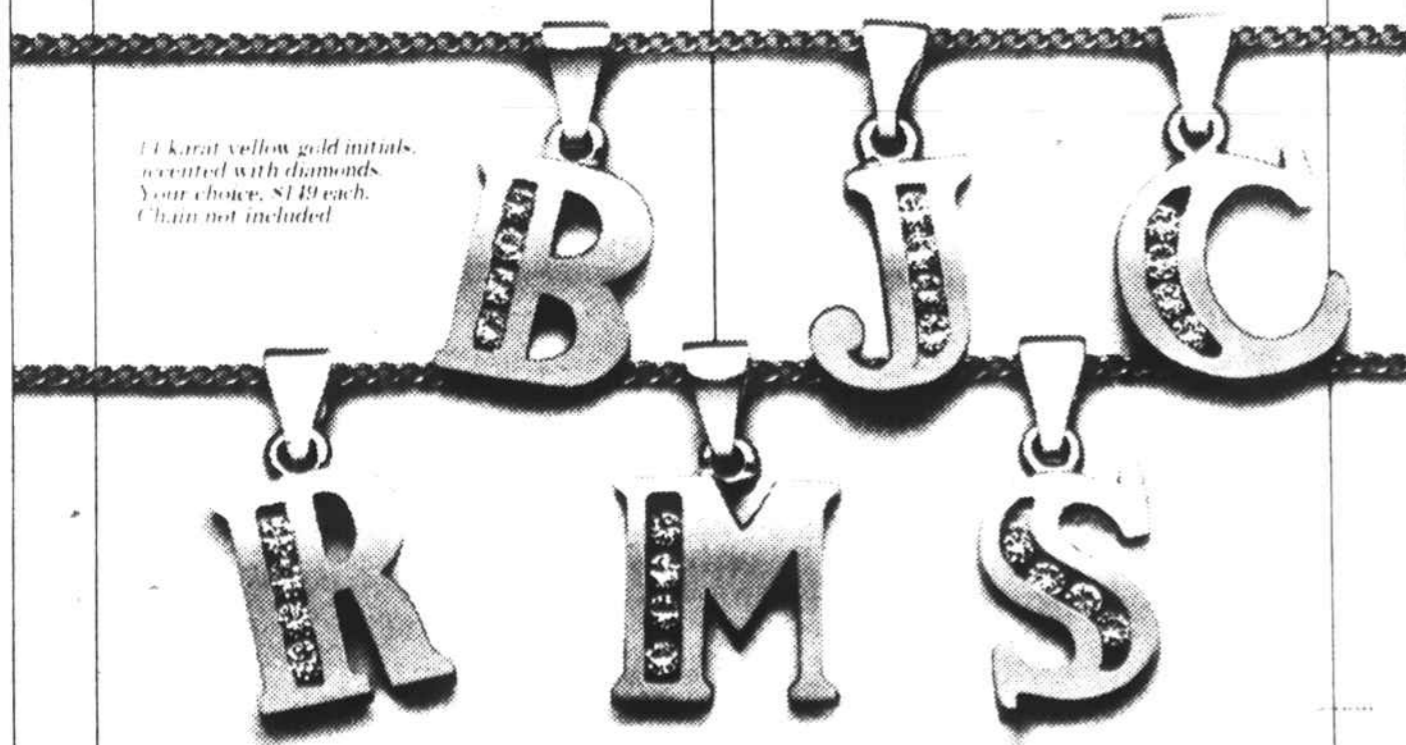
Mother Annie Carthron can best be remembered as the lady in white with her tambourine and cymbal at the downtown bus stop. She often visits the sick and shut-in.
