Meetings to be held

Public meetings concerning the future use or disposition of four Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Schools will be held in May.

Ferguson Elementary, Ardmore Elementary, North Intermediate (Optional Education) and Skyland Intermediate are among the schools to be closed in June under the reorganization plan. A Citizens' Committee has been appointed for each school to make recommendations to the Board of Education concerning possible future use of the building and grounds. The committees are particularly interested in hearing alternative proposals from developers or others interested in lease or purchase of the property.

The Board of Education has expressed its intention to sell the North Intermediate and Skyland Intermediate properties, and would like to lease or sell Ardmore Elementary.

The committees will meet at the schools on the following schedule: Ferguson, May 10, 4 p.m.; Ardmore, May 15, 4 p.m.; North Intermediate, May 22, 4 p.m.; and Skyland, May 29, 4 p.m.

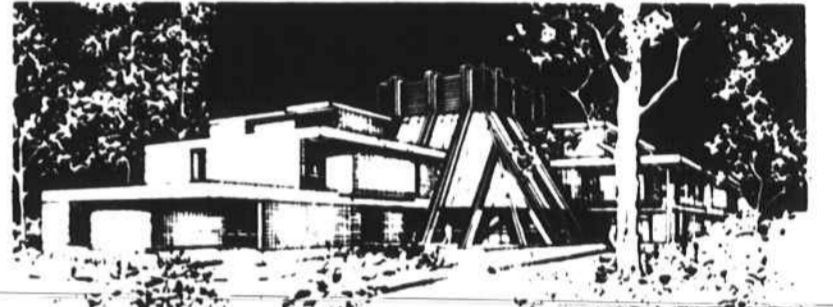
