David Russell receives Kappa scholarship

The Winston-Salem Alumni Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, as a function of the Chapters Guide Right Program, awarded David Russell, a rising seventh-grader at Old Town Intermediate School, a \$250 scholarship.

David will use the award to attend a two-week computer literacy camp at Winston-Salem State

University. The students in grades 4-6 and 7-10 will study BASIC programming on the Apple IIE microcomputer. David will attend the July 1-14 session of the computer camp and will stay on the campus at WSSU along with 25-30 other students.

David, who is a remedial reading student, also par-
