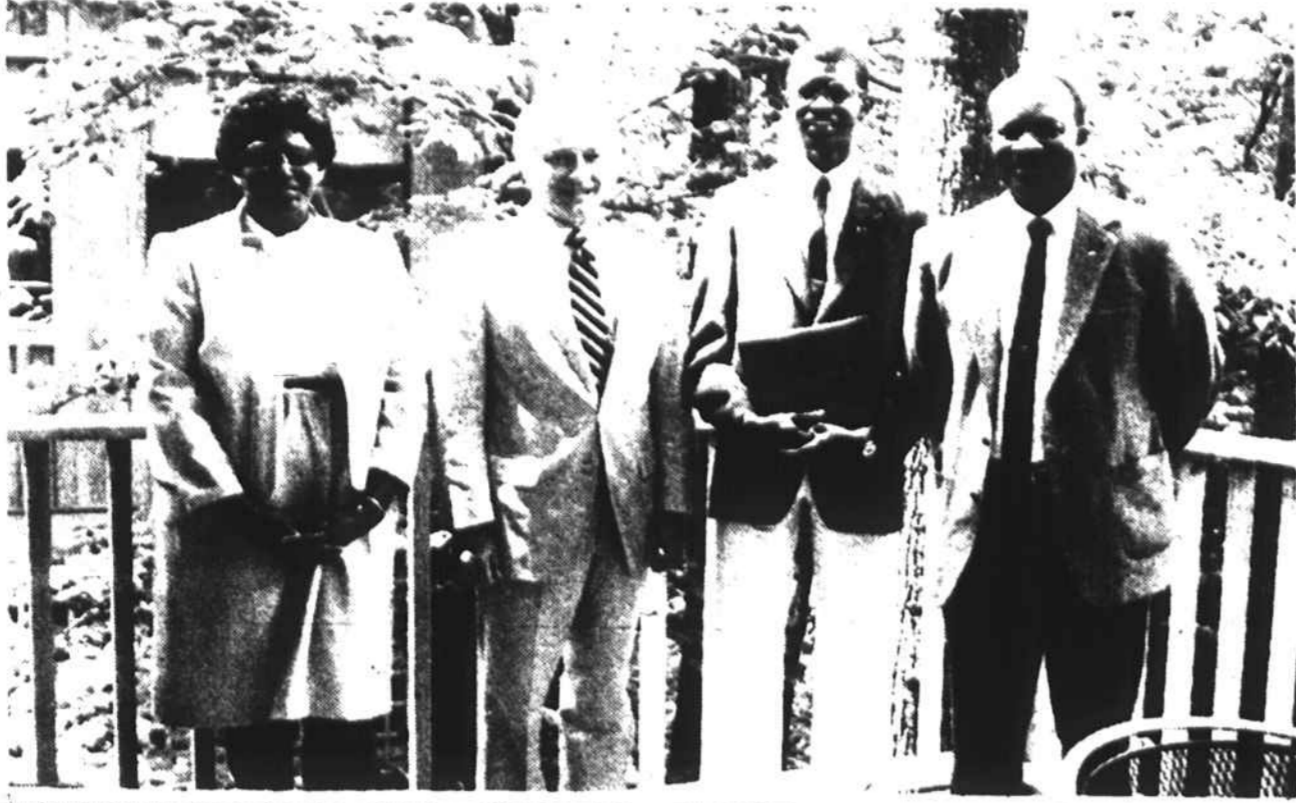


## Scott receives National Achievement Scholarship

George A. Scott, graduate of Parkland High School, has been awarded a four-year Armstrong World Industries Inc. Achievement Scholarship as a winner in the National Achievement Scholarship Program.
