Family members worshipped together at Turner's Chapel AME Church in High Point and returned to the hotel for a buffet-style dinner.

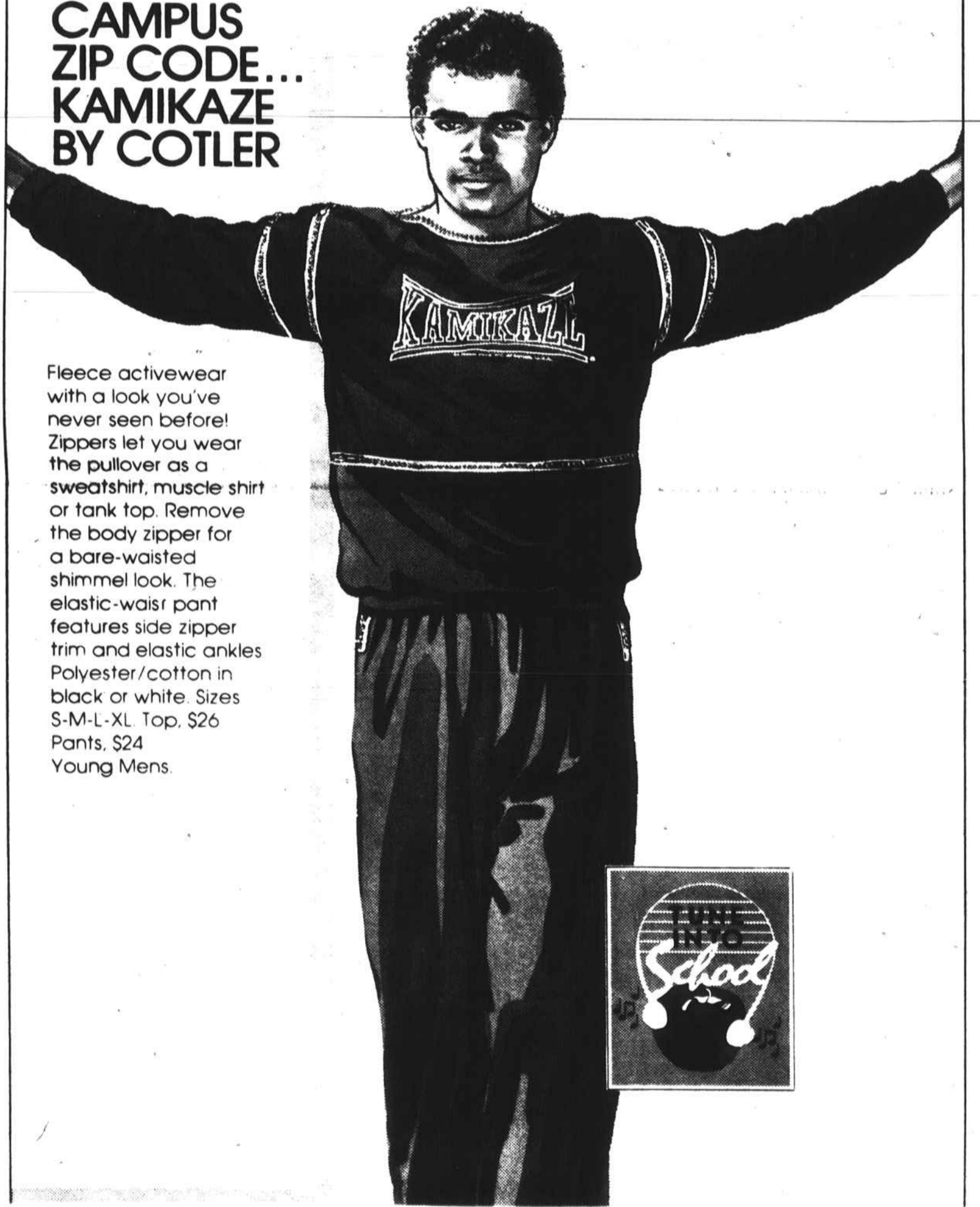
The reunion was hosted by a committee headed by Alvin Raper. Other members of the committee were Leroy Cole,
