During the nine-week course at the Naval Air Technical Training Center in Memphis, Tenn., Holman was trained in the inspection, maintenance and repair of aircraft frames, exteriors, ejection, air circulation and pressurization systems.

During classroom and practical application periods, he studied blueprint reading, corrosion control, metalworking, gaseous and liquid oxygen systems, ejection seats and canopies and fire extinguishing systems.

A 1980 graduate of East Forsyth High School, he joined the Marine Corps in May 1982.


