career took off, and he signed a recording contract.

Now, just about 30 years later, Checker is as popular and as wellknown as ever. His name is still a household word, and the dance that he popularized is virtually a part of American history.

But Checker says "The Twist" isn't making a comeback, because it has never gone anywhere.

"There is a misconception about 'The Twist,' '' said the soft-spoken Checker, his bluegray eyes lighting up as he talked about the dance and paused to offer a wave and a smile to two passing fans. "The Twist hasn't gone anywhere. It's defined as dancing apart. Before we started it, nobody danced apart. We started it, and now people are still dancing apart, so 'The Twist' never left. It's a part of

everyone's lives."

And Chubby Checker, too, is still around. In 1982, Checker released a new album after a nearly 16-year absence from the recording scene. The album, "The Change Has Come," has traditional Checker music on it but also features additional

music, more in line with the styles of the '80s.

"I'm still the same, and I'll never change as a performer," said Checker, who spends between 250 and 300 days a year on the road touring. "I'm doing some different things, but mostly I've just added on some songs and some new things, but I haven't really changed. I still enjoy performing my music, and I've just added on, not changed."

Checker, who says he has no regrets from his musical career, plans to keep adding on to his music as long as it feels right to him.

"I don't know how long I'll keep going, but when I'm done with it I'll be done with it," he said. "When I quit, I won't ever go back, and when I no longer perform, I won't give another autograph."


