# HOF sends nominations to committee

The Winston-Salem Sportsmen Club closed nominations for the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County High School Hall of Fame Monday.

"Joby" Hawn, a longtime high school official.

The club is in the final stages of putting together its fifth annual induction ceremony and will hold a press conference to announce the keynote speaker and master of ceremonies for the May 22 banquet.
