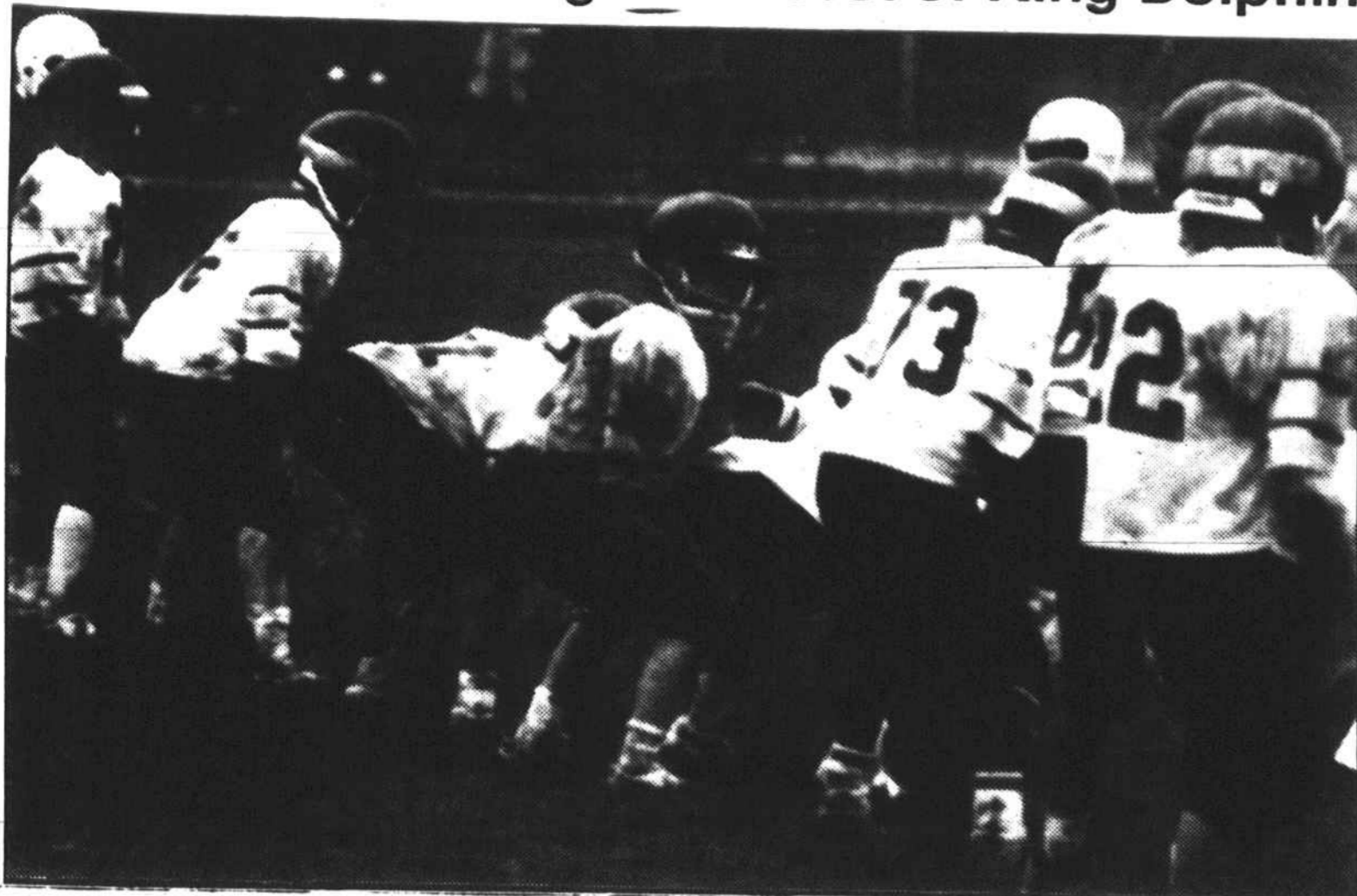


Demons-Wildcats get the best of King Dolphins with a sweep

apiece. "My offensive linemen's blocking was terrific," said Vikings offensive coach Andre Gould.

In the second half, the Falcons drew several unsportsmanlike conduct penalties which cost them critical yards. They finally got on the board when Michael Goldsmith caught a 50-yard touchdown pass from James Nelson late in the fourth quarter.

Goldsmith then caught another TD pass with 1:32 left in the game, this one, another 50-yard toss from Nelson.

The Vikings responded by scoring two more TDs to secure the win.

"I think that our players finally understood what we're trying to do," said Vikings head coach Willie Ashford. "I think they're ready to roll."

Along with Michael Goldsmith, Sullivan and Nelson, Anton Goldsmith came up with some big plays defensively with four solo tackles. Sullivan registered five tackles and had one quarterback sack.

"We could have won the game if had kept our mouths shut," said the Falcons M. Goldsmith in reference to the penalties assessed against his team.

Aggies whip FSU

Fayetteville State was fired

up for Homecoming, but in the end, North Carolina A & T came away with a 20-13 win.

The Broncos took what seemed like a commanding 13-0 lead before A & T retaliated. Walter Bond scored on a blocked punt to get the Aggies rolling.

In the second half, A & T started rolling as Steve Prince rushed for two touchdowns.

Defensively, linebacker Demetrius Harrison was the prime stopper for the Aggies with 12 tackles.

The Broncos defensive effort was led by nose guard Terrance Smith, who had 15 tackles plus one sack.

Howard tops Va. State

Howard's Bison took a 14-0 lead then held off a determined bunch from Virginia State to take a 17-14 win.

The Bison jumped on the scoreboard with a TD pass from Charles Lamback to William Sutton on an option pass. Rod Magnum added a second touchdown on a three-yard run.

The Trojans cut into the HU lead with a TD of their own near the end of the first half on James Harrison's five-yard run.

Howard led 14-7 at halftime. But Gary Mossop added a 41-yard field goal in the third quarter to stretch the lead to 17-7. The Bison defense kept the Trojans out of the endzone after they scored on a nine-yard pass from Wilton Anderson to Steve Maddux at the 9:06 mark of the final quarter.

Linebacker Dave Stewart produced a solid outing for Howard's defense with nine tackles, three sacks, an interception and one fumble recovery. In addition to his TD run, Magnum gained 89 yards on 18 attempts and freshman punter Cedric Rawls averaged 45.5 yards on six punts. Rawls placed three kicks inside the Trojans' 20-yard line.
