Howard tops Va. State

Howard's Bison took a 14-0 lead then held off a determined bunch from Virginia State to take a 17-14 win.

The Bison jumped on the scoreboard with a TD pass from Charles Lamback to William Sutton on an option pass. Rod Magnum added a second touchdown on a three-yard run.

The Trojans cut into the HU lead with a TD of their own near the end of the first half on James Harrison's five-yard run.

Howard led 14-7 at halftime.

But Gary Mossop added a 41yard field goal in the third quarter to stretch the lead to 17-7. The Bison defense kept the Trojans out of the endzone after they scored on a nine-yard pass from Wilton Anderson to Steve Maddux at the 9:06 mark of the final quarter.

Linebacker Dave Stewart produced a solid outing for Howard's defense with nine tackles, three sacks, an interception and one fumble recovery. In addition to his TD run, Magnum gained 89 yards on 18 attempts and freshman punter Cedric Rawls averaged 45.5 yards on six punts. Rawls placed three kicks inside the Trojans' 20-yard line.


