
'Ghoulies And **Ghosties And Long-Leggedy Beasties And Things That Go Bump In The Night ...'**

Governor hosts reception for historically black colleges, universities in the state

RALEIGH -- Gov. Jim Martin, the first governor to serve as honorary chairman of the United Negro College Fund State Campaign, recently hosted a reception at the Executive Mansion for representatives of North Carolina's historically black colleges and universities.

"I remain committed to keeping historically black colleges and universities as a vibrant force in North Carolina's educational system," Gov. Martin said as he greeted eight presidents and chancellors from the 11 predominantly black campuses. "This should be the goal of every citizen of our state."

The reception launched the Historically Black Colleges and Universities of North Carolina Conference in Raleigh and the 1989 United Negro College Fund State Campaign. Last year, more than \$1 million was raised during the cam-

During the reception, Gov. Martin signed a proclamation declaring December 1989 as United Negro College Month in North Carolina. The governor is a former member of the Board of Visitors of Johnson C. Smith University in Charlotte and has served as honorary chairman of the UNCF State Campaign since 1985.
