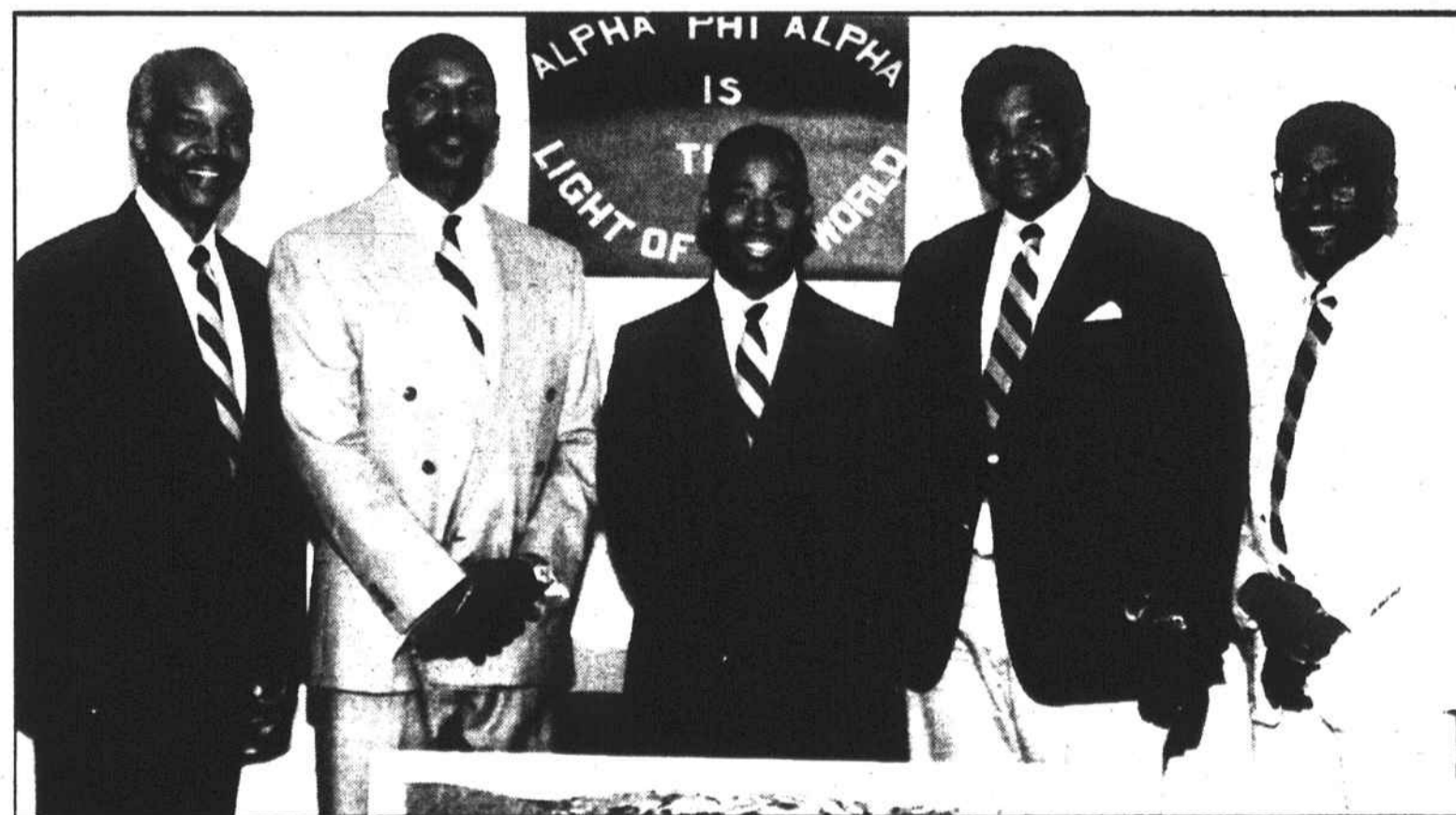
The bride is employed as a medical records clerk for the Forsyth County/Reynolds Health Center.
