



Dave Obrien's three-pointer at the end of the game lifted West Forsyth to a 61-58 victory over Greensboro Dudley in boy's jayvee action Friday at West. It was the fifth win of the season against two losses for the junior Titans.

In a game at Mt. Tabor. Chris Vernon scored 24 points to lead his team to a 58-47 win over Greensboro Grimsley. Daniel Webster added 17 points as Mt. Tabor upped its record to 7-2 on the season.

Davie County defeated Parkland, 69-56, on other boys' games. In jayvee girls action, West Forsyth defeated Dudley, 41-38, Mt. Tabor bested Grimsley, 40-11, Parkland lost to Davie County, 57-20, Greensboro Page downed North Forsyth, 41-32, and South Rowan beat Reynolds, 50-17.
