## Noted Author Claude Brown To Speak At WSSU

Claude Brown, the author of the best-selling autobiography, Manchild in the Promise Land, will speak at the next religion and ethic seminar being held at Winston-Salem State University in February.

Brown's talk will center on the survival of the African-American family, the theme of the third program in the "Religion and Ethics in 21st Century America" symposium that began last fall with presentations by the civil rights activist the Rev. Dr. Benjamin Chavis and the chaplain of Yale University, the Rev. Frederick J. Streets.

The program begins at 10 a.m. on Wednesday, Feb. 10, in Dillard Auditorium at the Anderson Center. The event is free and open to the public.
