All-America City Award Competition Names Finalist

Mayor Martha S. Wood received a call from the National Civic League this week saying that the city of Winston-Salem was named a finalist in the 1993 All-America City Award Competition. A record number of 151 applications were submitted for 1993

according to the Civil League.

Wood, who chairs the All-America City Award Executive Committee along with John Davis III and Geneva B. Brown, thanked all those involved with the application process at a luncheon meeting Tuesday at the Benton Convention

Center.

The application described three citizen-driven projects which significantly impacted the community within the last three years. Those three projects are Common Vision, the CIAA Basketball Tournament and the Community's War on

Drugs.

The city is one of 30 finalists and must now make a formal presentation at the 44th Annual All-America City Jury Hearings in Tampa, Fla. on May 20-22. From the 30 finalists, 10 communities will be designated "All-America City."

Students Needed For Archaeology Study

High School students can spend 13 days helping to uncover the history of one of the South's most important African-American churches. Students will work with Leland Ferguson and his staff from the University of South Carolina locating and mapping graves in front of the church and analyzing artifacts in the archaeology lab. No graves will be dug.

Workshops and lectures on archaeology, early local black his-

tory and the history of St. Philip's Church in Old Salem will be included. No prior related experience is required. Students need only bring interest, enthusiasm, discipline and energy.

Each student will be paid a \$150 stipend to cover expenses. Attendance will be required each day to receive the stipend.

The first session will be held June 7-23. The second session will

be held June 23-July 9.

Interested students should complete an application and return it by April 15. A teacher recommendation is required for each applicant. Students selected will be notified by mail on May 3.
