


In the 100 meter race first place went to Razzale from Mt. Tabor High School with a time of 13.32 seconds. Acker finished in second place for

The tournament pits All-Stars from the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA) against the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC) in the opening round game at 7 p.m. on Friday, April 23, while the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) All-Stars take on the MEAC later

The MEAC All-Stars along with Robinson are Delon Turner (6'5 forward) from Florida A&M, All Meac and conference leader in scoring at 21.5 points per game, Malik White (6'9 forward) from Morgan, Donell Thomas (6'9 forward) from Delaware State, Charles Solomon (6'9 center) from Howard, and Thomas Garner (6'5 forward) from North Carolina A&T to round out the front court.


