

A&T NCCU Series Will Continue

The Chancellors of A&T State University and North Carolina Central University announced today that the historic football game between the two universities will be continued in 1994-95.

In a joint statement, Chancellor Edward B. Fort of A&T, and Chancellor Julius Chambers of NCCU said:

"We are pleased to announce that we expect the classic football series between NC A&T State University and NC Central University to resume in the 1994 football season. We have directed the athletic directors at both universities to complete arrangements for the 1994 and 1995 games. Both of us are confident that an amicable agreement between our two institutions will be

reached so that this historic and highly-spirited rivalry can be preserved."

For a variety of reasons, negotiations for this year's game between the two institutions broke down, and ultimately both teams were forced to fill the open date in their schedules, making it impossible to play in 1993.

Hampton Wins CIAA Tennis Title

Hampton University kept its dominance of CIAA tennis with a 6-0 win over Norfolk State on April 17, at the HU Tennis Stadium.

This was Hampton's third straight title and their 20th CIAA title since 1969. This was also the first year of the intercollegiate tennis competition for second place Norfolk State.

In the consolation match, Shaw University defeated N.C. Central 5-1 for third place.

The Hampton University Lady Pirates, swept the CIAA Softball title in four games, stopping St. Augustine's College 7-6 in a thrilling eight inning final.

Senior HU pitcher, Rebecca Bradshaw had pitched three shutout games during the tournament, in leading the Pirates to the championship game.

In the semi-finals of the double elimination tournament, the Pirates defeated St. Augustine's 5-0, and St. Augustine's then defeated Shaw 8-4 to reach the championship game.

Lady Pirate senior catcher, Tonia Glymph was named tournament MVP as she continuously came up with the big hits. In the semi-finals and finals combined, she finished with six RBI's and three hits.

The tournament win upped the Lady Pirates record to 24-5 for the year.
