Her organizational memberships included Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Beta Zeta Omega Chapter (charter member of Beta Sigma

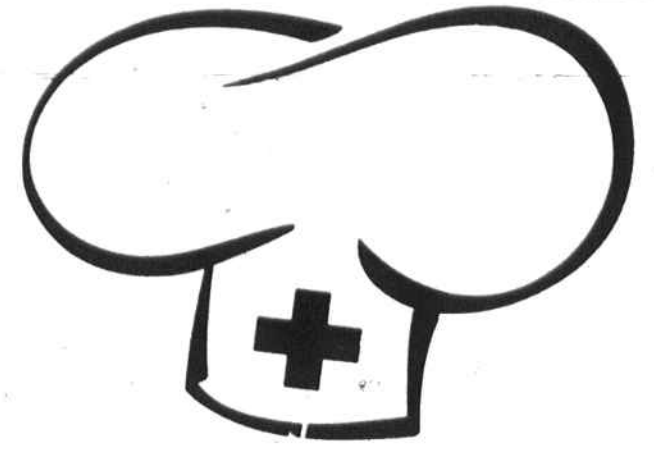
