

Booker Leaves Health Dept., Joins CDC

Yvonne Booker, winner of the Winston-Salem Chronicle's 1992 Community Service Award, has resigned from the Forsyth County Department of Health and has accepted a position with the East Winston Community Development Corp.

Booker, who was a community service consultant with the health department, said that the newly-created position of vice president for human development at CDC is not

too much different from her responsibilities at the health department. There, she said, she worked one-on-one with individuals. At CDC, her responsibility is to work in developing the whole family.

CDC is a non-profit, community-based outfit that helps with the economic development of East Winston.

"The best way to look at it is to say that I do the human side of economic development," said Booker, who has been in her new position since March 29.

About a year ago, she

explained, city officials and a foundation asked CDC to get involved in the administration of a program that involved working with families. Although the corporation participated, CDC officials realized they had a void that needed to be filled, Booker said.

She will step in to manage those programs and will help to create others, she said.

"It doesn't do any good to develop houses," she said, "if you don't develop the people who will live in them."

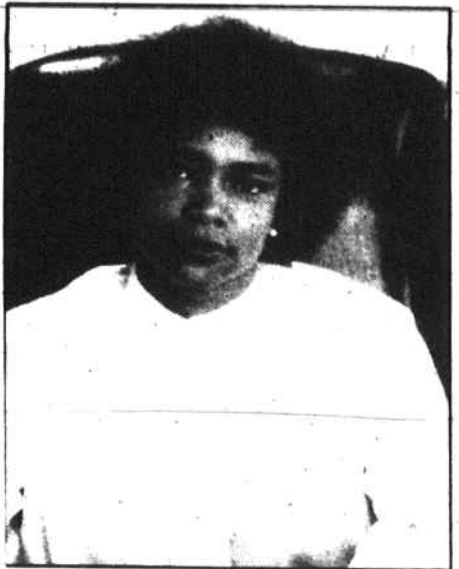
Evans Receives Degree
