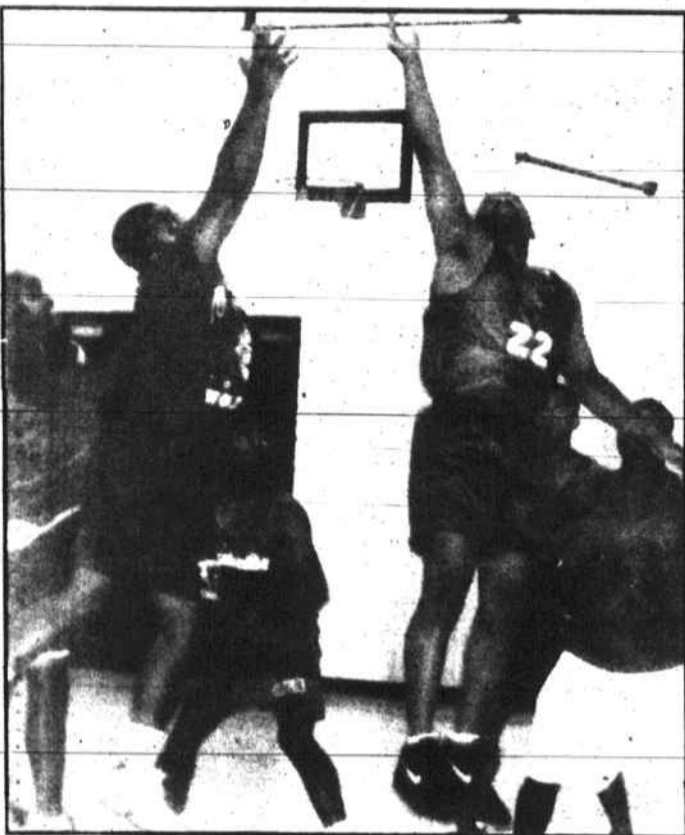




A player blocks an attempt to pass the ball.

In the second game, once again

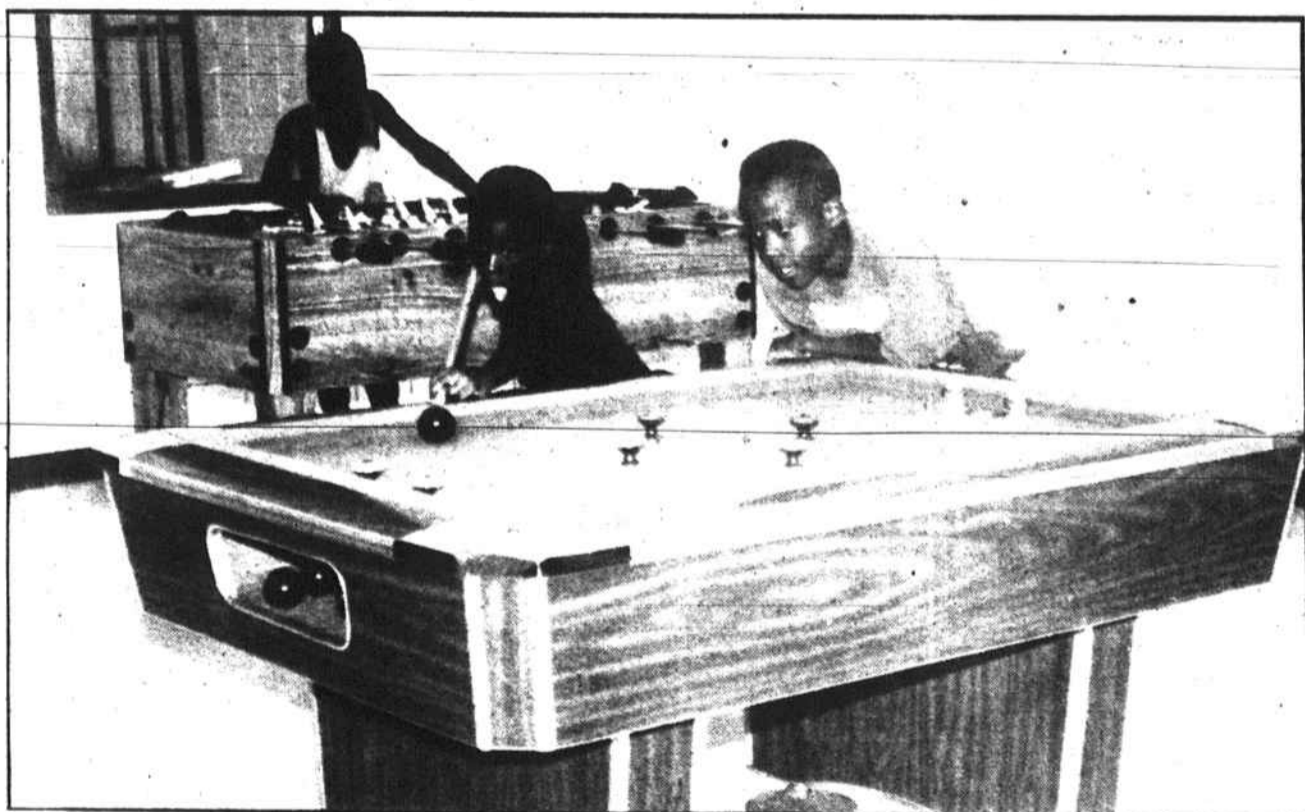
State Farm had trouble getting their players to show up, and once again they were run out of the gym.

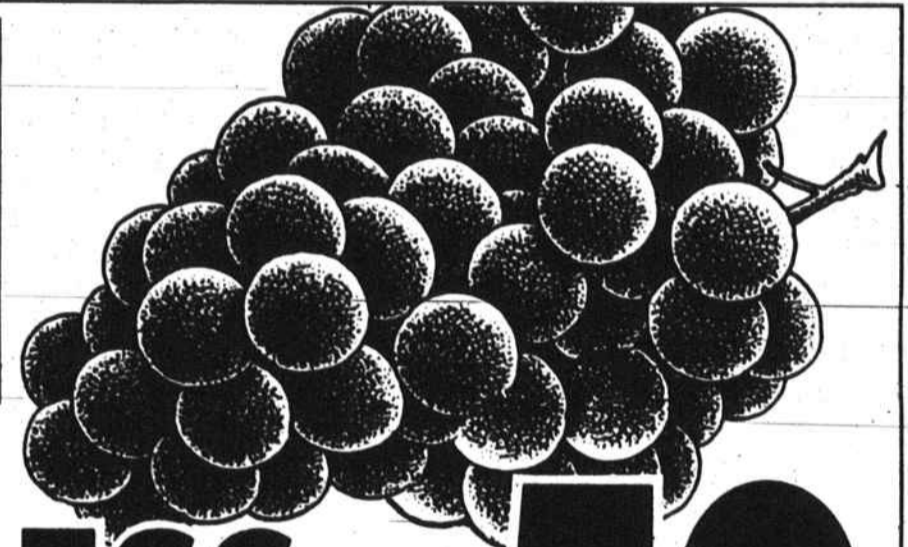
