The Sawtooth Center for Visual Art will present a lecture, "Folk Art from All Over! Motivation and Methodology" on Tuesday from 7-9:30 p.m. The lecture will be delivered by Brooke D. Anderson, director of the Diggs Gallery at Winston-Salem State University.

Anderson will talk about the work of self-taught artists from places as diverse as Poland, Brazil, Mexico, South Africa, England and the United States.
