MEAC Picks A&T Second in Finals

Defending Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) football champion North Carolina A&T State was picked to repeat, according to a poll by the visiting media representatives during the annual press luncheon.

The Aggies received 130 points of the possible 132 and 10 of 11 first-place votes, topping second place South Carolina State's 90 points and the other first place vote. Florida A&M was a close third with 88 points. Rounding out the order of finish was Howard with 66 points, Delaware State, 56 points; Bethune-Cookman, 28 points; and Morgan State, 13 points.

In the MEAC coaches-sports information directors poll, S.C. State was picked ahead of N.C. A&T.

The 1993 MEAC football pre-season prediction, according to seven MEAC head coaches and seven sports information directors, S.C. State will take the winning position this season with N.C. A&T State coming in second; third place, Delaware State; fourth, Howard University; fifth, Florida A&M; sixth, Bethune-Cookman; and seventh, Morgan State.
