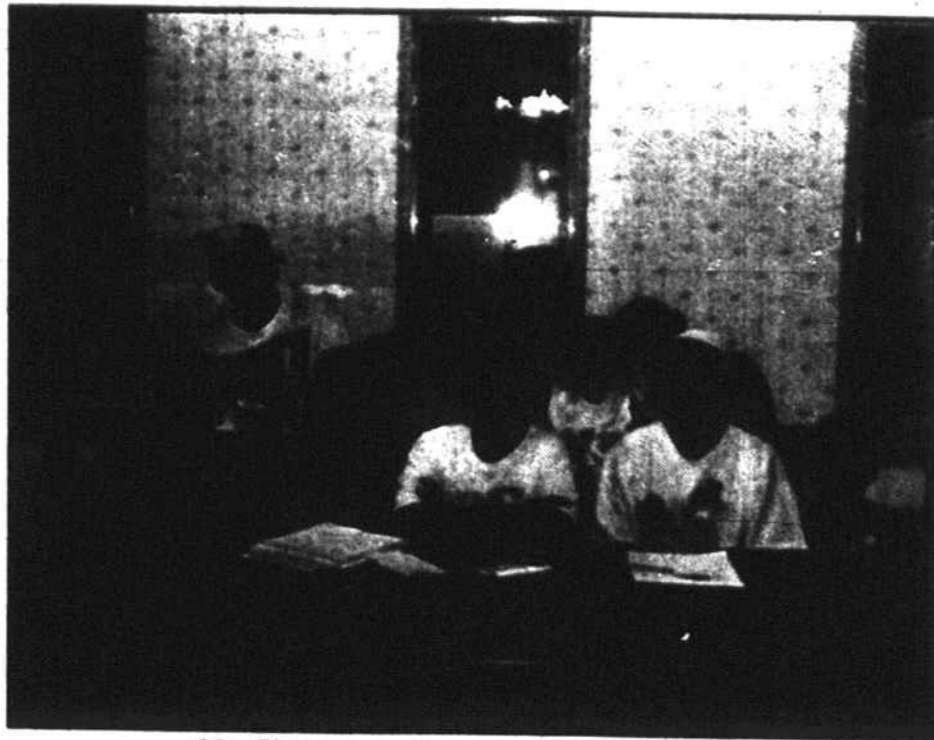
Based on their dedication, the youths are proud to be part of such a group.

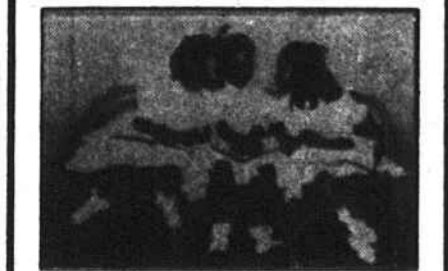
