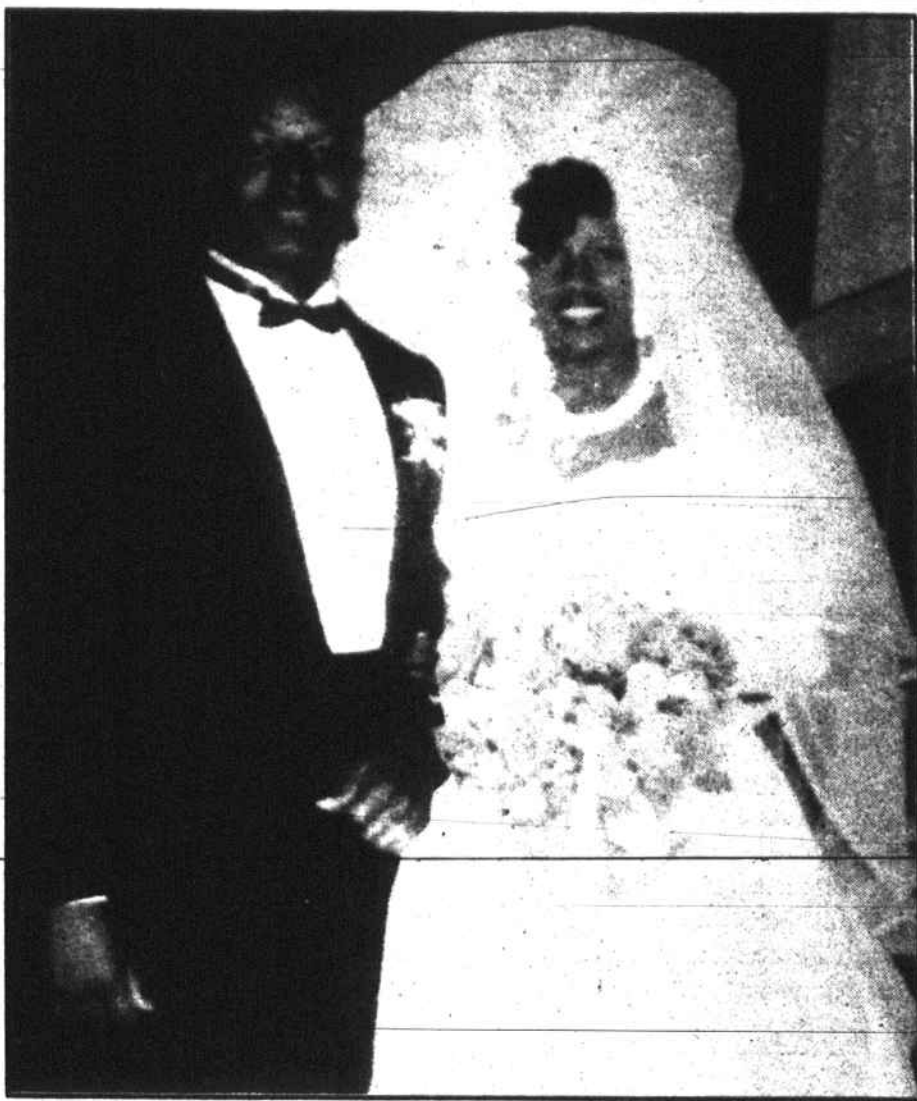
The bride was given in marriage by Deacon Ferguson.

Energy-Saving Tips for Appliances

During the 1990s consumers have continued to be more concerned with the environment and wise use of natural resources such as water, natural gas and electricity. Although major appliances make up only a small percentage of the total energy used in the home, energy consumption can be minimized through efficient designs, proper buying considerations and energy-saving practices.

In addition to baths and washing dishes, washing clothes is a fact of life. A lot of water is often consumed in the household in washing clothes. Adjusting the amount of water to the size of the load helps save cold water, hot water and electricity. Too much water can be wasteful, and not using enough with a load may result in a need to rewash items.

Learn to make proper water level adjustments to correspond with the load of clothes. To avoid overloading, the wash load should not exceed the top row of the tube holes.

Properly sort clothes according to color, use, fabric, surface texture, construction and degree of soil. Do not mix loads just to make a full one.

Pretreat heavily soiled or stained areas.

Use proper detergent amount for load size, soil level and water conditions. Recommendations on the back of the package are a good place to start.

If clothes are not heavily soiled, use a warm wash rather than hot. For very lightly soiled or brightly-colored items, a cold water wash may be used. When lowering the wash temperature, pretreating may be necessary.

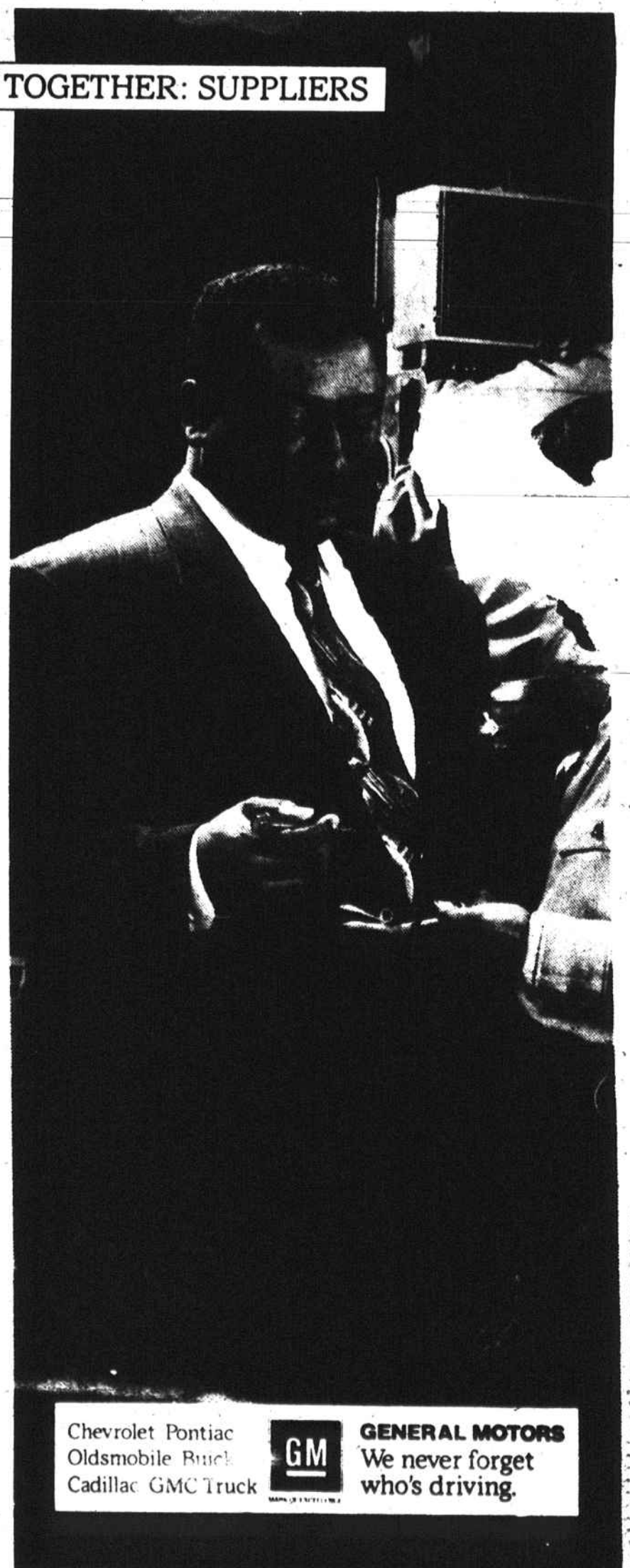
