Keith Spence led all Pirate scorers with 18 points, and Kevin Gregory added 15. On the second night of play, the Pirates defeated MBC, 76-73. Playing just 11 min-ty (1-1, 2-3) participated in the utes. Hampton forward Derrett Boyd connected on 9-of-14 field goals, scoring 20 points, and pulled in 11 rebounds.
