percent. "You aren't going to win many games shooting like that," said Faye, whose team was paced by Brown's 11 points.

Carolina fared better in the quarterfinals against another Indiana team when it nipped Indiana Northlake 64-62. The Hornets trailed much of the game before Dunlap's steal late in the game gave the Hornets their first lead. Carolina's Marcus Oliver led all scorers with 21 points.

Oliver's 19 points led the Hornets past Abbey AC of Ohio, 61-52, in the Sweet 16. Teammate Will Johnson added 16 points.

Carolina opened the medal round of the tournament June 30 with a 65-56 victory over the Nashville AFPC Rebels, despite losing starting center Qaid Rashid with a broken elbow in the opening minutes of the contest. Oliver scored 19

points and pulled down 10 rebounds to pace the victory.

The Hornets were undefeated in pool play, winning three games - starting with an opening 100-59 thrashing of the Kentucky Central Jaguars. A.J. Steele led the Hornets scoring with 17 points while Jason Brown added 16. Travis Holcomb-Faye handed out 10 assists.

The Hornets second game in pool play was against the El Paso

Golden Eagles. Carolina shot down the Texas team, 76-60, as Mike Dames scored 14 points. The Hornets final victory in pool play came against the Oregon Peninsula Blazers, 71-52. The Hornets trailed at the half, 29-27, but rallied after the intermission behind the play of Skeeter Powell, who scored 14 points and pulled down 11 rebounds, and Marcus Oliver, who scored 16 points.
