WXII-TV Expands Morning News

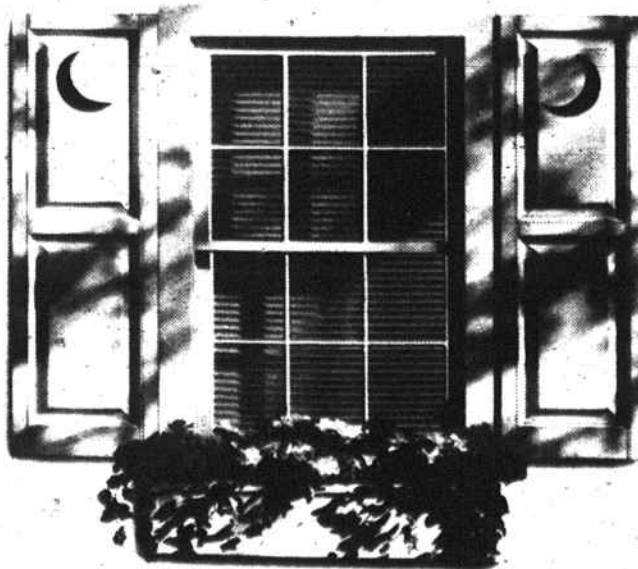
