Hoops action turns to conference play

Two men's NCAA Div. I black college basketball teams, and four women's teams have emerged from the annual pre-January massacres with winning records.

Meanwhile their Div. II counterparts are having much better luck with one men's team ranked in the top 25 and several women's teams in position to be ranked (when the women's Div. II rankings come out this week).

The unmerciful butt-kickings are over now as the Div. I teams prepare to take turns beating up on each other. We take a look this week at what has gone on to this point in the men's basketball season and give our first men's BCSP Top Ten. We'll look at the women next week.

MEN

**Bowie State** (7-1), a perennial CIAA doormat, is the surprise team of that conference and in all of black college basketball so far this season. They finished 6-20 a year ago.

The Bulldogs, led by second-year coach **Luke D'Alessio**, gave two-time defending CIAA cham-

pion **Winston-Salem State** their only loss (83-69) on Nov. 25 in Winston-Salem and have put together an impressive group of wins that has them ranked 14th in the nation in NCAA Div. II hoops headed into the new year. A'lessio, a former junior college coach, has brought in several Div. I recruits and has three players **Randy Gill** (14.0), **Sylvester Banks** (13.8) and **Jamal Shivers** (11.6) currently averaging in double figures.

BSU has a big date Jan. 2 in Petersburg, Va., when they face the 5-1 Trojans of **Virginia State** who are also off to a good start. The Bulldogs will then host 7-2 **Fayetteville State** (1/11), 5-3 **Shaw** (1/13) and 7-2 **Johnson C. Smith** (1/16) over the next two

weeks which should be a good indicator of just how far they've come.

As of the last ranking prior to the holiday break, the Bulldogs (3rd), JCSU (2nd), WSSU (4th), VSU (6th) and FSU (7th), are all in the top 10 of Div. II South Atlantic regional rankings.

**Hampton** (7-3, 2-1) is one of the two Div. I teams to emerge in the new year with a winning record. The Pirates, led by pre-season MEAC Player of the Year **Tarvis Williams**' 21.8 points, 6.7 rebounds and 4.7 blocks per game, have done well against lesser D-I competition including wins over E. Michigan, W. Michigan, Wisconsin-Green Bay and Chicago State. But the Pirates already have a loss in conference play to **Norfolk State** (87-86 on Nov. 29). Williams is second in the nation in blocked shots.

**Norfolk State** (2-8, 2-0) is winless outside the conference against stronger Div. I programs like Seton Hall, LSU, Maryland and Fresno State but has knocked off Hampton and Howard in the conference. Defending champion **South Carolina State** (4-8, 1-0) under head coach **Cy Alexander** is infusing a whole new set of tal-

ented players into the Bulldog line-up. SCSU has played relatively well in a tough non-conference schedule which means they will be a force again in conference play. A look at MEAC scores shows that once again come tournament time any of six or seven teams could take the title.

**Alabama State** (6-5, 2-0) of the SWAC is the other Div. I team with more wins than losses headed into the new year. But the Hornets have losses to MEAC members **Florida A&M** and **Coppin State**, and a loss to **Morris Brown** among their five defeats.

**Southern** (4-5, 2-0) looks to be the class of the SWAC. They have played .500 ball while losing decently to Tulane (82-75), SE Louisiana (66-63) and NW State (57-53). Defending tournament champion **Jackson State** is off to a horrible 0-12 start while 2000 regular season champ **Alcorn State** is also struggling at 2-8 though both wins are in conference play.

**Paine** (5-2, 2-1) is the only SIAC team ranked in the South Region rankings (tied for 10th). Defending champion **LeMoyne-Owen** (4-6, 3-2) is off to a slow start though **Ortiz Glaze** is filling it up. Glaze (22.6) is the second leading black college scorer behind **Livingstone** forward **Rodney Gidney** (25.2). Gidney is third in Div. II scoring while Glaze is 11th.

GOING BOWLIN': Grambling State wide receiver Scotty Anderson has been selected to play in the

**Delchamps Senior Bowl**, Jan. 20 in Mobile, Ala. Anderson becomes the first Grambling player to play in a major post-season All-Star game since defensive end **Albert Reese** was selected to the 1996 **Senior Bowl**. Anderson has two brothers who have played in the NFL, **Stevie**, a wide receiver with the New York Jets and **Anthony**, a defensive back for the San Diego Chargers. Grambling has sent 16 players to the post-season game. **Hampton** senior running back **Montrell Coley** will play in the **Hula Bowl** on Jan. 20 in Maui, Hawaii. Coley finished his career as Hampton's all-time leading rusher (3,838 yards), third best all-time in the MEAC, and broke the single season black college touchdown (28) and scoring mark (176 points) this season.

TOP ATTENDANCE: Southern University is at the top of the list of NCAA Div. I-AA schools in averaged attendance for football this year.

The Jaguars drew an average of 27,190 fans to their five home dates this season. Next in line among black colleges is **Florida A&M** which finished fifth with an average of 20,337 for their four home dates. Others in the top 20 include **N. C. A&T** (6th, 19,757 per), **Alabama State** (12th, 15,749), **Grambling** (13th, 14,563) and **Tennessee State** (16th, 13,987).

Leading the second team is quarterback **Darnell Kennedy** of **Alabama State** who guided the Hornets back to respectability this year as he threw for 3,163 yards and 29 touchdowns. Kennedy was the black college total offense leader. **Kentucky State** junior running back **Alvon Brown**, who posted his third straight 1,000-yard season (1,578) heads the second team ball carriers. He is joined by **North Carolina A&T** junior **Michael Hicks** who put up 1,487 rushing yards and 15 TDs in his first year of play on the I-AA level.
